## **Medication Instructions:**

Notify the office if you have an implanted heart defibrillator, pacemaker, or decreased kidney function If you have diabetes and take insulin, contact your physician that manages this for specific instructions.

1. If you check your blood sugars, test it the evening before and the morning of your procedure. If you have a low blood sugar on preparation and/or test day, you must treat it with one of the following: four or five glucose tablets non-red or purple in color, ½ cup apple juice, ½ cup white grape juice, or 1 cup real soda (15 grams of carbohydrate) and test your blood sugar more times than usual during the day while trying to keep blood sugar numbers between 100 and 200mg/dl. If low blood sugar persists, contact your health provider for guidance.

HOLD the following medications using these guidelines, unless otherwise instructed by your Primary Care doctor, Cardiologist or Endocrinologist

## Medications to HOLD the morning of the procedure

Oral Diabetes	Hold all oral diabetic medications. Check blood sugar if possible, prior to coming in.	
Blood Pressure & Heart Meds	<ul> <li>Ace Inhibitors: ending in "pril i (Lisinopril, Ramipril, Enalarpril or Vasotec, Moexipril or Univasc, Captopril or Capoten, Perindopril or Aceon, Accupril</li> <li>Angiotensin II Receptor Blockers (ARB's): ending in 'artan (Losartan, Valsartan, Benicar)</li> <li>Angiotensin II Receptor Blockers (ARB s) combined with calcium channel blockers such as (Amlodipine/Valsartan, Amlodipine/Olmesartan, and Telmisartan/Amlodipine)</li> </ul>	
Diuretics Water pills	HCTZ (hydrochloro-thiazide), Lasix (furosemide), Maxzide, Chlorthalidone, Dyazide (triamterene/hydrochlorothiazide), Spironolactone
